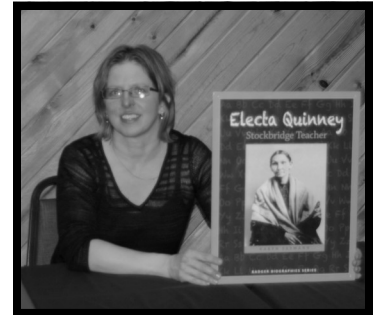

Saturday, March 5 noon - 2:00 PM



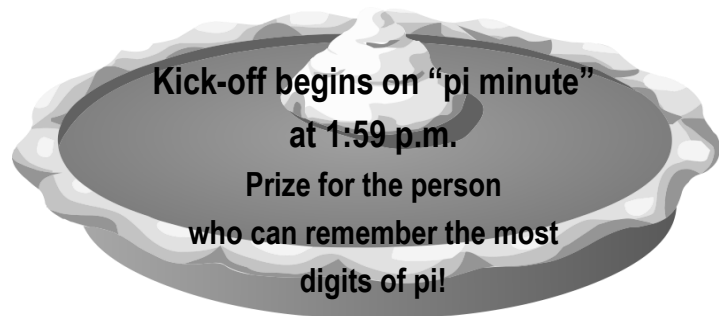

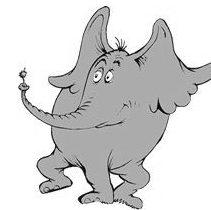
GET READY FOR SEUSSIAN SILLINESS

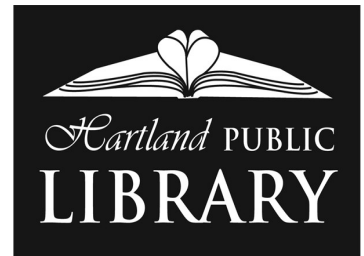

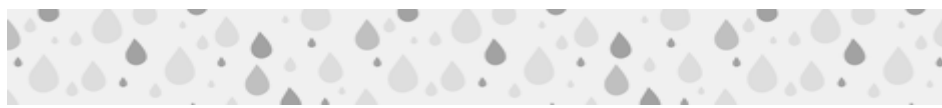
