The infant sessions are open to babies up to 23 months old. Their story times are 20-30 minutes long and feature songs and rhymes, stories, and finger plays.

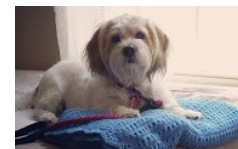

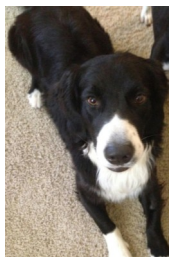

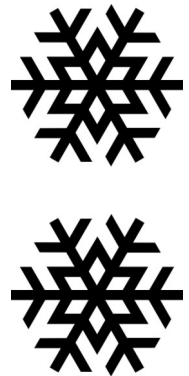
KIDS' CRAFTERNOON

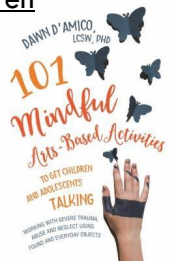

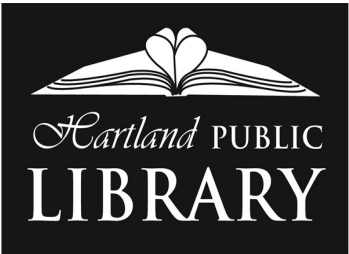
DAWN D'AMICO- LOCAL AUTHOR BOOK SIGNING AND FAMILY-FRIENDLY CRAFTING EVENT
