## Old World Wisconsin Heritage Animals & Agriculture Wednesday, March 7 6:00-7:00 p.m.



## Tuesday Morning Book Club


The Morning Book Club is a relaxed group of people who just enjoy sharing a great book! They meet on the first Tuesday of each month at 10 a.m.


## Bonus Book Club

***Sand County Almanac* by Aldo Leopold**


Nature writings of Aldo Leopold, one of the foremost conservationist of our century.
