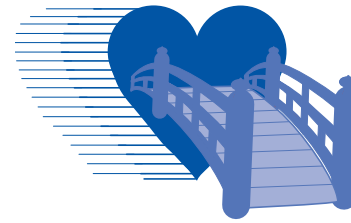

## Fall Leaf Collection Program

**Monday, October 11 –  
Wednesday, November 24**

The Village-wide leaf collection program begins on October 11th. One collection pass will be made throughout the Village weekly during the time period as noted above.

### Please follow these simple rules:

- Rake the leaves out to the street in neat piles or a continuous tight row or rake into the gutter area
- DO NOT BAG LEAVES
- DO NOT place yardwaste, brush, garden debris or animal waste at the curb or in with the leaves, it will not be picked up.

These items need to be taken to the Recycling/ Yardwaste site located at 701 Progress Drive.

Brr, it's that time of year again. Winter Parking Restrictions go into effect beginning on November 1 – March 31 of each year. During this time you are not allowed to park on Village streets from 2 am – 8 am. If you need to park your vehicle on the street during this time, call the Hartland Police Department Snow line at 262-367-0358 Extension 400 after 3:00 pm daily. The recorded message will indicate whether parking on the street is allowed or denied based on the daily weather forecast.

Parking citations will be issued to vehicles that park on the streets when the message has denied parking. A tow notice may also be attached to a vehicle if it is not removed within the time frame listed on the notice. The vehicle will be towed at the owner's expense.

### Trick or Treat Safety Tips:

- Purchase costumes, wigs and props that are labeled flame-resistant or flame-retardant. When designing a homemade costume, choose materials that won't easily ignite if it comes in contact with heat or flame.
- Avoid costumes with long or billowing features that could cause a trip or fall accident
- Provide children with flashlights to carry or as a part of their costume
- Use alternatives to candles whenever possible

#### SMOKE ALARMS

- Smoke alarms cut the risk of dying in a reported fire in half.
- Each year, nearly 3,000 people die in the U.S. home fires.
- More than half of the smoke alarms found in reported fires and two-thirds of the alarms found in homes with fire deaths were powered by battery only.

Safety Tip: Smoke rises; install smoke alarms following manufacturer's instructions high on a wall or on a ceiling. Save manufacturer's instructions for testing and maintenance.

Remember to check the batteries for replacement in the Spring and in the Fall.

## Reminder from the Hartland Water and Sewer Department

The sewer charge on your water and sewer bill is determined by averaging the water consumption used from September 15 – March 15 (January and April water/sewer bills). The figure is derived from the average number of gallons of water used during the winter months. This new average appears on the April bill each year and remains constant for the following three quarters regardless of current water usage. Using this methodology means you are not charged for sewer based on summer months watering uses.

3rd Quarter Water and Sewer Bills are due on October 20th.

### ARE YOU REGISTERED TO VOTE?

If you need to register to vote either because of a move or a name change, you may download the Voter Registration Form located on the Village website under the FORMS tab/Elections.

### Deadlines:

First-time voters who registered by mail and voters who register after the close of registration (which is the 3rd Wednesday before the election -October 13) and voters who register on election day must show proof of residence.

Reminder: Mail-In Voter Registration closes for the November election on October 13, 2010. After that date an elector who wishes to register in the Clerk's office will be issued a Voting Certificate which must be presented on Election Day in order to facilitate receipt of a ballot.

Special Voter Registration Hours: Wednesday, October 13 – Clerk's Office open from 7:30 a.m. – 6:00 p.m.

### ACCEPTABLE FORMS OF PROOF OF RESIDENCE

Forms of Proof of Residence must contain a complete name, including both the first and last name; and a current and complete residential address, including a numbered street address, if any, and the name of the municipality.

Forms which have an expiration date must be valid on Election Day.

- A current and valid Wisconsin driver's license
- A current and valid Wisconsin identification card
- A university, college or technical institute identification card or fee card that contains a photograph of the cardholder
- Any other official identification card or license issued by a Wisconsin governmental body
- An identification card issued by an employer in the normal course of business and bearing a photo of the card holder, but not including a business card
- A residential lease which is effective for a period that includes election day
- A real estate tax bill or receipt for the current year or the year preceding the date of the election
- A cable television, gas, electric, telephone or other utility statement for the period commencing not earlier than 90 days before election day
- A bank statement
- A current paycheck, or check or other document issued by a unit of government

### ABSENTEE VOTING

The Absentee Ballot request form can be found on the Village website under the FORMS tab/Elections.

The Clerk's Office is open daily from 7:30 a.m. – 4:30 p.m. We will be open on Thursday, October 28 and Friday, October 29 and Monday, November 1 until 5:00 p.m. to accommodate Absentee Voters.
