FALL LEAF COLLECTION PROGRAM

The Village-wide leaf collection program begins on Monday, October 1st and will continue through Wednesday, November 22nd. One collection pass will be made throughout the Village weekly during this time period.

We request the following:

- Rake the leaves out to the street in neat piles or a continuous tight row or rake into the gutter area
- DO NOT BAG LEAVES
- DO NOT place yardwaste, brush or other garden debris at the curb or in with the leaves, it will not be picked up. These items should be taken to the Recycling/Yardwaste site located at 701 Progress Drive

Yardwaste Site closes for the Season on Friday, November 23rd

The Yardwaste site closes for the Season on Friday, November 23rd. After November 23rd, No Yard Waste will be taken. The Yard waste site will reopen in April 2008. Please plan ahead to ensure that your garden debris and other yardwaste materials are taken to the site before the annual closing.

During the winter months, the Recycling Center will only be open on Fridays from 7:30 AM – 3:30 PM for dropping off recyclables only.

JUST A FRIENDLY REMINDER:

Garbage and recycling bins will be collected from curbside once a week if stored in containers no larger than 30-gallon garbage cans and not exceeding 60 pounds. Large items weighing more than 350 pounds will be collected on Wednesdays only. You must call ahead of time to have these items picked up by Veolia. Special arrangements must also be made for the pick-up of Freon appliances and tires. Carpeting must be tied and bundled into 4' strips. Call Veolia at 262 367-6040 for more information regarding special collections.

Municipal Code Section 74-29 states:

Refuse and recycling containers shall be placed at the curb not more than 24 hours preceding the normal collection day and shall be removed not more than 12 hours after collection.

It shall be the duty of the person placing the containers to be familiar with the collection schedule, and to place and remove the containers so that a neat and orderly appearance will be maintained.

The Hartland Police Department has the authority to contact property owners who are in violation of this Ordinance. Your cooperation is appreciated.

CITIZEN OBSERVER-We encourage all Hartland residents to participate in this program. The Citizen Observer is an electronic block watch where registered citizens automatically receive email messages from the Hartland Police Department about illegal activities, special alerts, or critical community notifications. To register, go to www.villageofhartland.com. Once on this website, go to Dept/Services, then Police and click on Citizen Observer. Follow the directions listed there. This program is available for businesses also. Call 262-367-2323 during normal business hours if there are any questions.

COMPUTERIZED VEHICLE REGISTRATION-The Hartland Police Department is an authorized agent of the Wisconsin Department of Motor Vehicles to provide vehicle registration and renewal services. To learn about these services, go to www.villageofhartland.com. Once on this website, go to Dept/Services, then Police and click on Computerized Vehicle Registration. Call 262-367-2323 during normal business hours if there are any questions.

ILLEGAL SIGN PLACEMENT-Village ordinances prohibit the placing of any signs in a right-of-way owned by the village, county or state. In addition, permission must be received from a property owner before placing any signs. Any signs observed to be illegally posted will be removed by the police department and discarded. The normal violations we observe involve rummage sale signs, campaign signs and realty signs. Contact the police department at (262-367-2323) if you have any questions before posting signs.

COMMUNITY NOTIFICATIONS-The Hartland Police Department is a member of a nation-wide notification network, which is basically a "Reverse 911" system. In the event an emergency message needs to be sent out to a targeted area of the community, we would utilize the services of this network. While your landline telephones would be contacted automatically with a recorded message about the alert, we also encourage citizens to sign-up with their cell phone number as well in order to get the alerts. This can be done by going to: www.achildsmismissing.org. Once on that site, click on "How to Join" and register your cell phone number. Examples of when these alerts may go out include: Missing Children, Missing Elderly, Evacuation Notices, and Sex Offender Notifications.

HYDRANT FLUSHING NOTICE

September 4th – 28th



The Department of Public Works will be flushing fire hydrants September 4th through September 28th. During this time, you may notice a slight discoloration or cloudy appearance in your water. This is due to the minor amount of sediment that accumulates in the water lines due to pumping the water from the ground.

Should you notice any discoloration, please run the water from your faucets until the water clears up. If you continue to have a problem or if you have any questions, please call us at 367-2714.

WATER & SEWER BILLS

The annual sewer averaging period begins on September 15th. The sewer average is based on the 4th quarter and the 1st quarter billing periods. Use water conservatively after September 15th to avoid an increase in the annual sewer average for your property.



The 3rd Quarter Water Bills (June 15th – September 15th) will be mailed on October 1st. The Water and Sewer Bills are mailed in a business size envelope and we ask that you return the top portion of the bill containing the bar code with your payment. Bills are due on October 22nd.

The Department of Public Works maintains the Village facilities, equipment and land including street right-of-ways, approximately 40.5 miles of streets, 25.6 miles of storm sewer, 1,051 storm sewer structures, DPW garage and Recycling/Yardwaste Site. In addition the DPW maintains 85.1 acres of park and other Village open space including 6 baseball diamonds, 4 soccer fields, 1 football field, 4.4 miles of asphalt/chip/boardwalk trail system, 4 tennis courts, 3 basketball courts, Fine Arts Center, 7 picnic shelters and the park equipment.

When you see the orange trucks traveling throughout Hartland this is just a brief list of the many activities they are involved with in addition to maintaining the water and sewer system throughout the Village.

NEWS FROM THE HARTLAND FIRE DEPARTMENT...

OCTOBER IS FIRE PREVENTION MONTH

The number of fire deaths throughout our nation during the first six months of 2007 has increased dramatically. Fire Departments have repeatedly noticed a lack of working smoke alarms, careless use of smoking materials or burning candles or improper maintenance of heating equipment as contributing factors to death and injury by fire.

During October the Hartland Fire Department asks that you inspect your home or business to help prevent fires:

- Check smoke and carbon monoxide alarms to be sure they are working properly
- Have an escape plan with a meeting place – practice with your family
- Once you exit your home, DO NOT return. Many people lose their lives going back into a burning home.
- Stoves are not made for heating homes
- Supplemental heating devices should be used and maintained in accordance with manufacturer recommendations. Keep combustibles clear. Do not leave supplemental heating devices unattended.
- If you are burning wood in your fireplace, make sure that the chimney is properly maintained. That goes for the furnace vent as well.
- IF candles are necessary, use them in a safe environment, in a fireproof container and away from children. Do not leave them unattended.
- And for the long term, consider getting a residential fire sprinkler. According to statistics, the risk of death by fire is reduced by 82% when smoke detectors are accompanied with residential fire sprinklers.

E.D.I.T.H. (Exit Drills in the Home)



Each year the Hartland Fire Department educates approximately 1,200 children on the importance of fire safety. A visit to the Hartland Fire Department includes hands on learning activities, a meet and greet with Firefighters, Survive Alive House demonstrations as well as the use of a real fire hose. Valuable lessons are taught and the importance of E.D.I.T.H. (exit drills in the home) are practiced.
