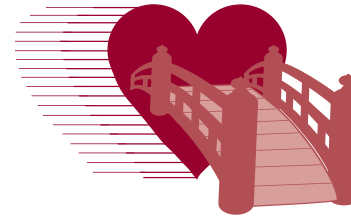

Electors currently registered to vote in Wards 8-13 will receive another blue postcard mailing with the directions to St. Charles and other pertinent information.

Voter Registration and Absentee Ballots are available at the Municipal Building, Administrative Office area during normal business hours of M – F, 7:30 a.m. – 4:30 p.m.

- Wednesday, October 15th – Open until 6:00 p.m.
- Saturday, October 25th – 9 a.m. – 12 Noon
- Thursday and Friday, October 30th & 31st
- Monday, November 3rd – Open until 5:00 p.m.



The Voter Registration Form and Absentee Ballot Form are available on-line at [www.villageofhartland.com](http://www.villageofhartland.com) under the FORMS tab/Elections. You may mail in your registration and absentee ballot requests. Make sure you follow the directions carefully and provide the proper "Proof of Residence" when submitting a registration by mail.

**Mail-In Voter Registration closes on Wednesday, October 15, 2008.** After that date an elector who wishes to register in the office will be issued a Voting Certificate which must be presented on Election Day in order to facilitate your receipt of a ballot.

### ACCEPTABLE FORMS OF PROOF OF RESIDENCE

Forms of Proof must contain a complete name, including both the first and last name; and a current and complete residential address, including a numbered street address, if any, and the name of the municipality.

### Mail-In Registrants & First-Time Voters

First-time voters who registered by mail, voters who registered after the close of registration (October 15, 2008) at the municipal clerk's office, and voters who register on election day all must show proof of residence.

## From the Police Department

**CITIZEN OBSERVER**-We encourage all Hartland residents to participate in this program. The Citizen Observer is an electronic block watch where registered citizens automatically receive email messages from the Hartland Police Department about illegal activities, special alerts, or critical community notifications. To register, go to [www.villageofhartland.com](http://www.villageofhartland.com). Once on this website, go to Dept/Services, then Police and click on Citizen Observer. Follow the directions listed there. This program is available for businesses also. Call 262-367-2323 during normal business hours if there are any questions.

**COMPUTERIZED VEHICLE REGISTRATION**-The Hartland Police Department is an authorized agent of the Wisconsin Department of Motor Vehicles to provide vehicle registration and renewal services. To learn about these services, go to [www.villageofhartland.com](http://www.villageofhartland.com). Once on this website, go to Dept/Services, then Police and click on Computerized Vehicle Registration. Call 262-367-2323 during normal business hours if there are any questions.

**ILLEGAL SIGN PLACEMENT**-Village ordinances prohibit the placing of any signs in a right-of-way owned by the village, county or state. In addition, permission must be received from a property owner before placing any signs. Any signs observed to be illegally posted will be removed by the police department and discarded. The normal violations we observe involve rummage sale signs, campaign signs and realty signs. Contact the police department at (262-367-2323) if you have any questions before posting signs.

**COMMUNITY NOTIFICATIONS**-The Hartland Police Department is a member of a nation-wide notification network, which is basically a "Reverse 911" system. In the event an emergency message needs to be sent out to a targeted area of the community, we would utilize the services of this network. While your landline telephones would be contacted automatically with a recorded message about the alert, we also encourage citizens to sign-up with their cell phone number as well in order to get the alerts. This can be done by going to: [www.achildissmissing.org](http://www.achildissmissing.org). Once on that site, click on "How to Join" and register your cell phone number. Examples of when these alerts may go out include: Missing Children and Missing Elderly. Call 262-367-2323 during normal business hours if there are any questions.

Starting November 1, 2008, several changes have been made to the Winter Parking restrictions in the Village of Hartland. The entire ordinance is listed below, but the specific changes expanded the restricted time frame to 2:00 am to 8:00 am, and reduced the time frame for towing the vehicle from 24 hours to 6 hours after issuance of a citation and tow notice.

### WINTER PARKING RESTRICTION WARNING ORDINANCE 82-4(b)

No person, except while on an emergency call, shall park or permit any vehicle to remain parked on any street or highway in the Village between 2:00 a.m. and 8:00 a.m. during November through March. Signs giving notice of this restriction shall be placed or erected at or near the Village limits on all state and county trunk highways and connecting streets entering the village. Such signs shall be reflectorized and of a type approved by the state highway division as to size of lettering, shape and color. Any vehicle remaining in violation of this ordinance for six (6) hours after removal notice has been posted on said vehicle may be towed and the costs for said towing and storage is the responsibility of the vehicle owner. Notice of removal shall be in the form of a notice or placard affixed to the vehicle. Costs for towing and storage under this section shall be in addition to any forfeiture imposed by the court upon conviction for violation of this ordinance.

As the leaves begin to fall this autumn, many people are faced with the decision of how to handle the leaves on their property. Yard trimmings are banned from Wisconsin's landfills, and while some municipalities offer a leaf pick-up, many do not. Thus, disposing of the leaves becomes the homeowner's responsibility. Even if your municipality does offer leaf collection, it is a costly disposal option for your municipality.

So what is a resident to do? There are several easy options that allow residents to take care of yard trimmings and leaves on their own property.

- Mulching leaves in place. This option is faster than raking and allows the nutrients in the leaves to return to your soil. Get your lawn ready for winter by allowing leaves to decompose on your lawn. Several passes over your leaves with a lawnmower (a regular blade or mulching blade) will chip the leaves into small pieces to feed your lawn.
- Composting. Composting is another way to use leaves as a valuable resource. If you start composting this fall, you can have usable compost for your yard by spring!
- Organic Mulch. Spread leaves and shredded brush around plants and trees to help keep a moderate temperature and retain moisture. Compost and mulch also helps control soil erosion.
- What not to do. Do not burn leaves. This is a health hazard for people with allergies and asthma, a fire hazard, and creates air pollution. It is also a waste of resources.

### FALL LEAF COLLECTION PROGRAM – Monday, October 13 – Friday, November 21

The Village-wide leaf collection program begins on October 13th. One collection pass will be made throughout the Village weekly during the time period as noted above.

### Please follow these simple rules:

- Rake the leaves out to the street in neat piles or a continuous tight row or rake into the gutter area
- DO NOT BAG LEAVES
- DO NOT place yardwaste, brush or other garden debris at the curb or in with the leaves, it will not be picked up. These items need to be taken to the Recycling/Yardwaste site located at 701 Progress Drive.

### YARDWASTE SITE CLOSURES FOR THE SEASON ON FRIDAY, NOVEMBER 28, 2008

The Yardwaste Site will close on Friday, November 28th and will reopen in April, 2009. Please plan ahead to ensure that your garden debris and other yardwaste materials are taken to the site before the annual closing date.

During the winter months, the Recycling Center will be open on Fridays from 7:30 a.m. – 3:30 p.m.
